SEP Project Co-ordinator Role

The SEP is made up of private sector individuals, community organisations and elected members who, due to their own organisational commitments, are unable to manage and deliver all identified key projects in the Growth Framework. It is widely recognized that for partnerships to be effective they require collaboration, strong management and co-ordination. The Partnership supports a project co-ordinator, self-employed on a contractual basis (with Sedbergh Community Trust as Accountable Body) for a maximum of 70 days per annum.

Reporting to a programme management committee, the co-ordinator looks after the SEP and takes a key role in identifying, developing and implementing initiatives that strengthen Sedbergh's position as a key town within Cumbria and the Yorkshire Dales.

Principal activities

- Develop and deliver on behalf of SEP, key project areas identified in the 2021 Sedbergh Growth Framework and 2018 Sedbergh Economic Study.
- Provide strategic overview and operational direction for the SEP.
- Champion the work of the SEP and projects among public, private, voluntary and community partners and ensure that priorities are aligned.
- Work with and encourage public and private sector organisations to develop their involvement in delivering a wide range of projects in Sedbergh.
- Develop strong working relationships with key funding bodies, stakeholders and local businesses, investigate funding packages and secure funding for priority projects.
- Promote active participation from local businesses;
- Respond on behalf of SEP to local and regional matters such as local plans, consultations, economic initiatives, local enterprise partnership programmes.
- Work with partners to promote and support cross-sector economy and promote the town to a wider audience, in line with strategic direction.
- Work with partners and other organisations to secure future funding to continue the programme of delivering the vision for Sedbergh.
